Consultation Report

Project Overview

Each year Council prepares a draft annual business plan and budget detailing the proposed new projects, initiatives and services for the upcoming financial year, how we will fund the plan and current year highlights.

This coming financial year Council has allocated over \$140,000 of funding to progress and develop numerous strategies that will take our community forward and make headway into achieving our long term vision. The Draft Plan is also underpinned by the values and goals contained within the recently adopted Disability Access and Inclusion Plan and Reconciliation Action Plan.

Some key priority projects proposed under the Draft Annual Business Plan and Budget 2021-2022 include:

- \$2.2M to commence the Foreshore Redevelopment (\$7.2M over 3 years);
- \$1.015M to implement projects under Council's Stormwater Management Plan;
- \$720,000 for renovations and upgrade of ArtEyrea;
- \$500,000 to upgrade existing footpaths and build new footpaths;
- \$441,000 to upgrade and develop recreation spaces including Lincoln South Reserve (\$250,000), Puckridge Park (\$100,000) and the Train Playground (\$91,020);
- \$200,000 towards Open Space Projects which may include dog park development;
- \$70,000 towards a partnership with Country Arts SA to engage an arts and cultural facilitator to deliver local programs;
- \$70,000 to implement actions from the CBD Access and Parking Action Plan to activate more car parking in the city centre;
- \$20,000 to develop an Economic Development and Investment Action Strategy; and
- \$32,000 to deliver economic development and tourism initiatives including tourism marketing campaigns to drive growth in the sector.

As well as leveraging external funding opportunities, to fund this plan, Council proposes increases in revenue from rates and service charges as follows:

- Total general rate revenue increase of 4%;
- \$10 increase in the Fixed Charge component of the general rate, which is included in the total rates revenue increase of 4%;
- Unit charges for Waste and Recycling remain unchanged from 2020-2021; and
- Regional Landscape Levy (previously NRM Levy) increases on average of 2%, as advised by the Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board.

The 4% increase in general rate revenue equates to approximately an \$18 increase per quarter for a home with a site land value of \$160,000.

Wages are not increasing (mine hasnt) and some people dont even have jobs. Ive spoken to retired and the elderly who are struggling to pay rates. This is just ridiculous! 12	Business Plan 2021 22	The TPS support the budget allocation of \$20,000 for the progression of the provision of a suitable pontoon facility in the Lincoln Cove marina. The TPS has worked with council over the past 10 years to achieve such an outcome. The TPS believe the pontoon will provide a unique opportunity to service the commercial and recreational sectors. The \$20,000 investment in engineering works to allow for a future application to the boating facilities fund, to finance a \$500,000 to \$700,000 90m pontoon, will progress this much needed and commercial positive addition to the infrastructure of the Lincoln Cove Marina. Should a suitable marina pontoon be constructed the TPS have concepts that will add to Port Lincolns tourism offerings (see previous submissions We do not think that an extension to the town jetty is a wise use of ratepayers money and are pessimistic to the usefulness of a facility that is not all weather or suitable for berthing modern vessels All boating investments should be focused on the improvements of the Lincoln Cove precinct. Feedback on Annual Business Plan and Budget 21-22

The introduction from the Mayor indicates there will be "possibly some progress towards establishing a dedicated dog park." Why can't this be fully budgeted and funded this year? If the Staff Appreciation Dinner and associated Fringe Benefits Tax was removed from the budget, this would free up around \$20k to make definite progress on this objective, which is long overdue. It is insulting to the community to fund such an extravagant dinner, when so many are struggling. Council should fund its own staff appreciation dinner, through social club mechanisms, or senior staff and elected member donations.

Where is the LGA data coming from, as the Census data for 2016 at the Australian Bureau of Statistics has very different representation of some of the statistics used in the ABP. Eg, median household income is \$1,081p/w which would be good to see reported. 76.1% have internet accessed from dwelling not 71.5%; population was recorded as 14,064. There seem to be some inconsistencies, including industry of employment, but the one I was actually checking for unemployment appears consistent. Would it pay to check the sources of information?

Layout of the ABP is very visual, which is good.

How will the the 'Measuring our Success' actually be measured? Are there KPI's to support these claims?

Capital Expenditure:

Please do not allocate \$100,000 to the Hallet Place Redevelopment. Please instead work toward saving these buildings, and adapting their use, if necessary. With the Visitor Information Centre now relocated to the former Eyre Travel, there should be no urgency to do any further work in this area, but to engage further with the community to determine the long term future for the site.

The Flinders Theatre and Baptist Church could be repaired for less than demolition costs, as quoted by Mr Bob Hanchant, at approx \$1.6m. Council should consider this as a future objective.

Arteyrea renovation totalling \$720k is this value for money? Where are the plans for the public to view on what is proposed for this building, and the costings? Considering the repair costs quoted by Mr Hanchant for the Theatre and Church, \$720k sounds excessive, for a small group of users. Where can members of the public see the business case for this?

The Leisure Centre seems to require a money pit of renewal. Can some of this be postponed so as to allocate funds to a dog park?

\$260k for shared infrastructure at Lincoln Cove East and South Point Reserve – what is this? Can some of this be postponed to enable a dog park to be allocated in 2021-22?

Open Space Projects – what are these, and can the dog park be prioritised?

Great that there is \$1.015m for stormwater management.

Rates should be reduced to 2.5% and if budget considerations need to change, then Arteyrea should be dropped from the budget, as well as the Hallett Place redevelopment and those groups utilising this space, re-homed if possible if urgent works are required.

My rates have gone up since 2013-14 by 39%. Last year, Council didn't fully deliver its projects – where have those savings gone? Salaries, Fringe Benefits are going up – how many FTE does this fund in Council? How many people does it staff?

Council should also reconsider its Cruise ship funding. What analysis is there, on the benefits to tourism and dollars spent in the city? There should be a much greater recovery on this expense – charge bus users for a pass, or tour operators. Ratepayers should not be funding this, without more information.

Council should consider subsidising travel from the airport to be fair on tourists flying in, if it continues to subsidise cruise ship tourists.

The Playground Audit \$16k sounds like a good thing. Perhaps this could be completed, before adding the playground to the foreshore, to see what best meets the needs of the community.

Spendmap has been removed from the budget – what data has been collected and is this available to the public and/or tourism operators and businesses? Why has it been removed?

What is 'Tourism Other' of \$15k – can better use be made of the videos being created, to reflect a family oriented experience as well as luxury experiences?

I think council should listen to community concerns, and be more transparent in what it identifies in the Budget and Business Plan – nowhere does it mention the Flinders Theatre, but Hallet Place is used to identify this expenditure instead. Previously, I think it was referred to as 'Civic Hub'.

A great job has been done, presenting the figures and visuals – please reallocate some of them, for community priorities.
