We fully understand the need for reduced parking times where there are retail shops however where there are professional offices such as accounting firms then a 1 hour parking time is unreasonable for our clients to come and see their adviser or tax agent. The current time of 4 hours is sufficient not 1 hour. WE can't see why one side of Lewis street can't be 1 hour (the side of the retail store) and the other side be 4 hours as it is now. We paid the council \$75,000 for parking when our renovations were done and we have received no benefit to date.
